Conservation of Urban Soil and Water Resources

Soil Erosion Sediment Control Program

The Soil Erosion Sediment Control (SESC) program is conducted through an interagency agreement with the US Army Corps of Engineers and 6 municipal agreements. The program aims to control soil erosion and sedimentation in and near waters of the United States.

Enhancement and Protection of Natural Areas

Cost-Share Programs

The Illinois Department of Agriculture, facilitated through KDSWCD, provides cost-share dollars to assist landowners in the construction of approved practices that conserve soil and protect water quality. The two programs landowners may apply for are the Streambank Stabilization and Restoration Program (SSRP) and the Conservation Practices Program (CPP). In 2012, the KDSWCD provided technical assistance and \$48,321 of cost share for:
